- ▶ when buying fruit ask for heirloom fruit varieties (weekly market, trade)
- ▶ buy products from local orchards, e.g. apple juice, fruit brandy
- ▶ discover orchards and cider presses as a place of learning and adventure

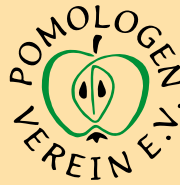
The Pomologen-Verein e. V. was founded in 1991, in the tradition of the »Deutscher Pomologenverein« (1860–1919).

Preserve heirloom fruit varieties!

Who still remembers the heirloom varieties?

- For decades standard fruit trees have been vanishing from gardens and orchards almost unnoticed. With their disappearance we lose many of the heirloom variety our ancestors once cherished, made use of and propagated. Who does still know "Prinzenapfel", the plum variety "Kirke's Blue", "Muskateller" pear or the cherry variety "Königin Hortensie"?
- Varieties we only remember from tales told by our grandparents. Many of them have disappeared silently. Each loss means an irretrievable loss of valuable properties like disease resistance.
- Specialization on few main varieties has caused a great loss of biodiversity. Market restrictions have led to cultivating short lived bushes or spindle trees that have supplanted long lived standard trees. At the same time home grown fruit does hardly contribute to our daily diet any more being replaced by standardized fruit from the supermarket.
- Fruit varieties are a living cultural heirloom we try to preserve for future generations. More than 30 years of activities in the field have paid off: Our members have been able to save numerous varieties from extinction.

What we do!

- We find, identify, preserve and propagate heirloom fruit varieties and plant conservation orchards.
- We campaign for the preservation of heirloom fruit varieties being seen as an important task in public.
- We hold lectures on identification of fruit varieties and care of fruit trees.
- We organize fruit exhibitions.
- We advise on new plantings, recommend varieties for different regions especially for private gardens, orchards and self sufficiency.
- We carry out trials with new varieties so as to evaluate their suitability for standard orchard planting.
- We maintain and develop the database of the preservation network of fruit varieties www.obstsortenerhalt.de.
- We offer selected specialist literature in our online shop <https://shop.pomologen-verein.de>.
- We publish a yearbook which is free for members and organize symposia and excursions.
